COUNCIL

Wilmington City Council met in regular session on Thursday, September 19th, 2019 at 7:30 p.m. with President Mark McKay presiding.

CALL TO ORDER

President of Council called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

ROLL CALL

Roll Call: J. McKay, present; Snarr, present; Fickert, present; Purkey, present; Liermann, present; Swindler, present; Williams, present.

Interim Chief Ron Cravens was present as Sergeant at Arms.

Council participated in the Pledge of Allegiance and moment of silence.

PRESIDENT OF COUNCIL

President M. McKay asked if there were any changes to the agenda.

Motion by J. McKay and seconded by K. Fickert to approve the agenda as presented. Motion passed.

Agenda approved as presented.

President M. McKay asked if there were any changes to the minutes.

Motion by K. Swindler and seconded by B. Liermann to approve September 5th minutes as presented.

Motion passed.

Minutes approved as presented.

MAYOR

Mayor Stanforth mentioned upcoming events, including Art & Soul Festival and After Fest, Tai Chi Park events, and farmer market updates for the coming weekend. He also noted the downtown Food Truck Mondays, a Lunch & Learn focusing on disaster preparedness, and the 22nd anniversary of Cardboard City.

Mayor Stanforth read statement regarding Wilmington's homeless and vagrancy challenges, stating they have grown into a public health and public safety issue. Stanforth stated the Police Department have a record of 387 individuals with "at-large' addresses. Mayor Stanforth stated that a group effort with local agencies will be required to begin to research and solve these problems. Stanforth stated he will need Council's help and approval to implement the new strategies moving forward.

AUDITOR

Auditor Hollingsworth was in attendance. He presented the State of Ohio Auditor's Award of Excellence for the 2018 fiscal year. He thanked his staffed for their work and gave them the credit for the success.

SERVICE AND SAFETY DIRECTOR

Director Shidaker summarized his two pieces of legislation stating they have received \$3.1 million so far in grants for the Rombach Project, and this legislation would allow him to apply for \$651,000 more. He also stated the rest of the funding would be acquired through a 0% interest loan that they were working together with the Auditor's office. B. Shidaker also reviewed the fall paving plans and summarized the legislation for the bidding process.

In regards to the OPWC grant, there is an initial scoring system in which the project got high marks, and Shidaker stated he is confident in our success on the Rombach project.

COMMITTEE REPORTS AND ACTION
