CALL TO ORDER

President of Council called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m.

Council participated in the Pledge of Allegiance and moment of silence.

President McKay asked if there were any changes to the agenda. Council Clerk J. Dickman stated there were minor technical modifications to the agenda.

MAYOR

Mayor Stanforth thanked the Board of Election for their work on the election. He thanked Dave Jackson for his years of service as the street sweeper and announced Annen Vance has moved to code enforcement.

Mayor Stanforth announced the hiring of Dr. Trevor Bates as President of Wilmington College and that leaf pick-up is progressing. Brian Shidaker will discuss several road paving projects tonight.

SERVICE AND SAFETY DIRECTOR

B. Shidaker provided an update on major projects including street improvement projects in the Northwest Quadrant in 2021, Mulberry Street in 2021, South Street Safety Improvements in 2021, Rombach Avenue and Rombach Avenue Waterline in 2021, Grant Street Waterline in 2020, David's Drive Phase I in 2022/2023, David's Drive Phase II in 2023/2024, and David's Drive in 2024/2025, and Airborne Road. Further projects include Clarksville Connector Trail in 2021, Wastewater Treatment Plant, Sugartree Corridor Project, Sugar Grove Cemetery Bridge in 2021, Burtonville Reservoir Infrastructure Improvements in 2021.

<u>City Revitalization Committee</u> – Chairman M. M Snarr presented on Coronavirus Relief Fund Local Assistance Small Business Emergency Relief Grant Program.

The City Administrator, Marian Miller spoke briefly regarding Coronavirus Relief Fund Local Assistance Small Business Emergency Relief Grant Program. M. Miller asked for a motion to approve any spending under the program by Council in order to ensure compliance with potential federal requirements. Spending has been allocated based upon federal guidance and the collaboration amongst the Administration, Auditor Mary Kay Vance, and the Clinton County Chamber.

Rick Schaffer stated the increase will result in an additional anticipated revenue of approximately \$12,000 a year.

Motion by K. Swindler and seconded by M. Purkey to give the first reading by title only on Ordinance No. O-20-49 an Ordinance Establishing Bulk Water Purchasing rates. 7 yeas.

The Law Director read the Ordinance by title only.

Chairperson K. Swindler asked that Council conduct second and third reading at the next meeting on Ordinance No. O-20-49.

Chairperson K. Swindler brought Resolution No. R-20-39 a Resolution Authorizing the Director of Public Services to Apply for, Accept, and Enter into a Water Supply Revolving Loan Account (WSRLA) Agreement on Behalf of the City of Wilmington for Replacement of Lead Water Service Lines, and Designating a Dedicated Repayment Source for the Loan.

R. Schaffer discussed all lead lines on Grant Street property will be replaced and City is monitoring safety of water in the area.

M. Miller stated if the City of Wilmington comes across a replacement of a line it is replaced.

Fickert to give the first reading by title only on Resolution R-20-39 a Resolution Authorizing the Director of Public Services to Apply for, Accept, and Enter into a Water Supply Revolving Loan Account (WSRLA) Agreement on Behalf of the City of Wilmington for Replacement of Lead Water Service Lines, and Designating a Dedicated Repayment Source for the Loan. 7 yeas.

K. Swindler spoke regarding CARES ACT Relief funds to help residents to pay water bills when in risk of having water being shut-off through the State of Ohio. K. Swindler believes this is an area to consider analyzing in the future to expand to City permanently.

R. Schaffer says local office allows application and they communicate with his office in order to not shut off water. However, as of right now, the program will only last until the end of 2020.

Solid Waste/Recycling Committee- Chairperson J. McKay had no report.
